

Living Wage for All: State and Federal Paid Family and Medical Leave

What happens if you or a loved one falls ill and you receive no pay while you're out of work? Or when a parent needs time to spend with a newborn? Families can face loss of income (\$0 wages), debt, possible job loss, lower Social Security and savings, and physical

and emotional stress. Only 17% of the U.S. workforce has access to employer-sponsored paid family leave.


