KETTERING HOSPITAL is welcoming volunteers to make **HOSPITAL FACE MASKS** from their homes. The directions for sewing the masks is attached **HERE**. As you sew these, be sure to put the wire in the top part of the masks if possible. It makes for a more secure fit around the nose, twist ties have been used and complete directions are on the instructions. **When the masks are complete**, you can drop can drop them off at Soin, Kettering or Sycamore Hospitals at the main entrance. These hospitals will provide a bin inside their main entrances starting Saturday (3/28) for completed masks.

SOCIAL ACTION HIGHLIGHTS

WHY SOCIAL ACTION? Often the leadership of UMW has been asked, why is social action and advocacy important?

It is because our work as far back as 1869, when Methodist, Brethren and Evangelical women saw



the inequities of treatment of women, youth and children around the world, they felt called by God to do something to stop the pain and suffering. The first women missionaries were sent to India because of the non-existence of medical care and education for women, which resulted in many deaths and needless suffering. Today that calls continues to many parts of the world, our country and even our own communities.

United Methodist Women interprets the biblical passage from Luke 4:18 as both a model and a mandate for Christian social action and advocacy: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

United Methodist Women has been challenging social injustice for almost 150 years. Members improve the lives of women, children and youth nationally and internationally. United Methodist Women continues its advocacy work on peace and justice, education, the rights of children, human rights, and farm workers' rights, to name a few.

In all advocacy efforts United Methodist Women supports its work with a scriptural basis and adheres to the denominational mandates in the Book of Discipline and Book of Resolutions of The United Methodist Church.

Here are some actions that you or your local UMW unit can support in the ongoing work of United Methodist Women that brings wholeness to body, mind and soul!

END the SCHOOL to PRISON PIPELINE - As United Methodist Women members and friends, we are called to do all we can to interrupt the school-to-prison pipeline. Children of color, especially, are far too often targets of broken and biased systems. We know that racial disparities are rampant in schools, with Black girls about six times as likely to be suspended as white girls.

Our legislators have a unique opportunity to help end school pushout by supporting an important new bill, HR 5325, the Ending Punitive, Unfair, School-Based Harm that is Overt and Unresponsive to Trauma (PUSHOUT) Act of 2019. The Ending PUSHOUT Act will:

- create a \$2.5 billion fund to incentivize schools and states to abandon unfair and discriminatory disciplinary policies and practices that push children of color out of the classroom;
- strengthen civil rights monitoring and enforcement; and
- establish a task force to address school pushout, with particular attention to the needs of girls of color.

Participating states and schools would be supported to invest in restorative practices and trauma-informed care using counselors, social workers and mental health professionals. Funds could not be used for police in schools. While this bill is not a one-and-done fix, it would be a substantial step forward in the ongoing work of interrupting the school-to-prison pipeline and ending school pushout.
